

ANATOMAGE TOURNAMENT: IN-PERSON HOST REQUIREMENTS

MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL

Preface

Anatomage encourages hosts to read these rules before hosting any tournaments.

1. Host Eligibility

A host must meet the following requirements:

- 1.1 Must be an Anatomage Table customer.
- 1.2 In-person tournaments must have a minimum of 2 Tables operating.
- 1.3 All tournaments must have a minimum of 2 schools participating.
- 1.4 All tournaments must have a minimum of 12 teams competing.
- 1.5 All contact information such as schools attending, team names, team point of contact information must be provided to Anatomage.

2. Team Eligibility

- 2.1 Each team must have a minimum of 3 students with an appointed team captain. No more than 5 students per team.
- 2.2 Teams must be composed of students from the same school.
- 2.3 To be eligible to participate, students must be enrolled in school full-time.
- 2.4 No students may compete in more than one team.
- 2.5 It is encouraged that there is an educational coach, advisor, or teacher that helps prepare the teams for the tournament using resources such as anatomy and physiology books and more.

3. In-Person Tournament Structure

- 3.1. In-person regional tournaments will be placed in a head-to-head bracket tournament style. Two teams compete against each other.
- 3.2 Each tournament will have at least 1 preliminary round, each team will be placed at an Anatomage table and quizzed on the same set of questions during each round. Teams with the highest combined point totals from the preliminary rounds will advance to the elimination rounds. The number of teams advancing to the elimination rounds will be decided by the tournament officials.

- **Preliminary Round:** all teams will answer the same set of questions
- **Regional Finals - Top Eight:** will include the 8 teams with the most points in the preliminary round.
- **Semi-Finals - Top Four:** will include the 4 teams with the most points in the top eight-round.
- **Finals - Final Two:** will include the 2 teams with the most points in the top four championships round. The team with the most points will be assigned the winner of the Anatomage Tournament.

3.3 It is required to report the top 3 finishers of the Tournament to Anatomage.

3.4 If the top 3 high school finishers want to be considered to attend the National Anatomage Tournament, that will need to be indicated in the submission.

4. In-Person Tournament Technical Requirements

4.1 Venue where the tournament will be hosted must have electric power connections to support the 2 Tables, power connection of 100-240v each.

4.2 Venue where the tournament will be hosted must have a reliable internet connection.

4.3 Venue must have 2 projectors, 2 large screens with an HDMI input to project the 2 Anatomage Tables to the audience, and 1 microphone to address the audience.

5. In-Person Tournament Venue Space Requirements

5.1 Venue must be able to accommodate the minimum team quantity, a total of 36 students plus other officials.

5.2 Venue must be able to accommodate a minimum of 2 Anatomage Tables.

5.3 Venue is recommended to have a stage to introduce teams, make announcements, and celebrate winning teams.

6. In-Person Tournament Equipment Requirements

6.1 In-person tournaments must have a minimum of 2 Tables operating.

6.2 Presets or custom quizzes uploaded and ready to use in Anatomage Table Software.

7. Anatomage National Tournament Eligibility

7.1 The Anatomage National tournament is an opportunity for the top high school teams from across the nation to compete on a national scale.

7.2 To qualify for the Anatomage National Tournament, tournaments must have taken place within the months of January-June.

7.3 The top 3 high school finishers' must have been submitted by a tournament official no later than the end of June.

7.4 Grand prizes will be awarded to the top 3 national winners.

8. Tournament Schedule

8.1 Each team will register through the Anatomage registration webpage.

8.2 Each team will be able to select and sign up for their preferred time slot for each round.

8.3 Preliminary rounds consist of 15-minute time slots. This time can be allotted in any way the team desires as long as the quiz round is completed by the end of the 15-minute mark.

Following is a suggested schedule to divide the time within the 15-minute slot:

- In the first 5 minutes, the tournament official will go over the tournament rules and application controls.
- In the next 5 minutes, the team can practice interacting with the Table ensuring they have good control over the Table and how the quiz functions.
- The round will begin when the team announces they are ready or once the 10 minutes have been reached.

The preliminary quiz consists of 25 questions in 4 minutes.

8.4 Semi-final rounds will consist of 10 minutes time slots. The round will begin once all the team members are present and the tournament official is ready to begin. The semi-final quiz consists of 30 questions in 5 minutes.

8.5 The final round will consist of 10-minute time slots. The round will begin once all the team members are present and the tournament official is ready to begin. The semi-final quiz consists of 35 questions in 6 minutes.

9. Tournament Question Requirements

9.1 It's recommended to download and use Anatomage preset tournament questions.

9.2 You may create your tournament questions, however, submission of your tournament questions must be provided to Anatomage to ensure the minimum questions per round meet the minimum quantity. Submit your tournament quiz to tournaments@anatomage.com for approval.

9.3 Failure to meet tournament minimums will not qualify for Anatomage National Tournament.

9.4 The tournament questions must meet the following requirements:

In-Person Tournament Minimum Questions

- **Preliminary Rounds:** 25 questions - 4 minutes
- **Regional Finals - Top Eight:** 30 questions - 5 minutes
- **Semi-Finals - Top Four:** 30 questions - 5 minutes
- **Championship Round - Final Two:** 35 questions - 6 minutes

9.5 We encourage verbal, visual, or written communication between the team members during the tournament rounds.

10. Timing

10.1 Registration slots are provided to give students enough time to sign on to Anatomage zoom room and that each student is connected properly. Times slots should consist of the following:

- Preliminary Rounds - 15 minutes
- Semi-Finals - 10 minutes
- Finals - 10 minutes

10.2 The rounds are played until the time expires or all the questions have been answered.

11. Rules for Breaking Tie

11.1 If a tie exists at the end of the round, the team who skipped less will be deemed the winner and continue to the next round.

12. Scoring

12.1 The tournament questions will be scored in the following format:

- Correct answers, worth 2 points
- Incorrect answers will count as -1
- Skipped questions, worth 0 points.

13. Reporting Requirements

13.1 Anatomage encourages, but does not require, hosts, to do the following:

- Report results to Anatomage promptly after the event. This enables Anatomage to invite top teams to its National Tournament.

14. Tournament Promotions

14.1 Host is required to effectively promote the tournament at their own expense.

ANATOMAGE TOURNAMENT: IN-PERSON HOST GUIDELINES

Introduction

The following guide is intended to help you organize a successful tournament. This is not intended to be a comprehensive guide, but to be used as a reference point that will help and assist your planning.

1. Purpose of Tournaments

1.1 The purpose of the tournaments is to support students' anatomy and physiology learning while fostering collaboration and teamwork.

1.2. The tournament encourages students to interact with an Anatomage Table, a 3D interactive table to identify anatomical structures.

2. Sportsmanship

2.1 At all times, we encourage fair play, ethical behavior, and integrity.

2.2 Individuals, regardless of their role in the tournament, are expected to be aware of their influence on the behavior of others and model good sportsmanship.

3. Tournament Officials

3.1 It is recommended there is a tournament director who is the final on-site authority regarding the tournament regulations and final ruling. The tournament director is encouraged to report the top 3 finishers of the anatomy tournament to be entered in the Anatomage national tournament.

3.2 It is recommended that each tournament have a moderator. The moderator will enforce time limits, supervise the clock, award points, and otherwise enforce the rules of the tournament. If necessary, the moderator will brief the teams before the start of the tournament; either verbally or in writing.

3.3 Other officials are recommended to assist the moderator with their duties including, but not limited to, keeping score and supervising the teams.

4. Tournament Equipment

4.1 It is encouraged that you have a physical or a digital tournament bracket board to display the team names advancing to the next tournament round.

5. Tournament Promotions

5.1 It is encouraged that you begin your tournament promotions as soon as possible, however, no less than 2-3 months away.

5.2 It is recommended that you have a website or landing page to promote and provide students with tournament details. Including a sign-up form or link for students to register is encouraged.

5.3 We advocate announcing the tournament on all social media platforms.

5.4 We encourage using email tools to upload email lists and send emails announcing the tournament.

5.5 It is recommended that you develop a press release that you can send to local media outlets.

6. Tournament Prizes

6.1 It is recommended that the top 3 teams are awarded Anatomage certifications.
